The abbot then blesses each new lifevowed member, being joined in the laying on of hands by other lifevowed members (including their companion in the discernment journey if present), as all members of the community raise a hand in blessing.

Loving God, you abide with us in life and in death, in joy and in sorrow. We give thanks for the grace given to [Br./Sr.Chosen Name(s)] who this day have (has) made lifelong vows in our Order. Send down your Holy Spirit upon them (her/him). Continue to uphold them(him/her) by your power, renew them (her/him) in your Word, and sustain them (him/her) with the means of grace that, throughout their lives (her/his life), they (he/she) may keep these vows to the honor and glory of Your Name, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

As the new lifevowed member stands, an additional knot is tied in her or his cincture by the companion or another lifevowed member.
