As with all of your officers, we have (busy!) day jobs as well. Plus, it's summer and I've got baseball games to attend; thanks to the intercessions of Brother George Crisp, I did make it to Wrigley Field while I was in Chicago. Wrigley was a religious experience in its own rite.

And speaking of the website, Council unanimously acclaimed our webscribe, Br. Stephen Ball, as the Order of Saint Luke "Man of the Year" for 2006-07. At last year's spring meeting, the Council initiated overhaul of the website, which led to Stephen's appointment and the outstanding work that he has done. We don't even have a "Man of the Year" award in the Order of Saint Luke, but our Brother is our honoree this year, anyway. Thanks, friend.

Annual retreat is coming very soon—October 15-18, with Council staying the extra day and departing on October 19<sup>th</sup>. I realize that going to California may be a challenge for some of you, but no more than it is for our loyal Californians who travel east most years. I've also found Southern California in mid-October to be its own reward. As to financing attendance at the retreat, both yours and others', I encourage you to think creatively and act boldly. This year's topic—on the Emergent Church—is particularly timely, and Brother Stanley Tanner has assembled a strong leadership team. Karen Ward is a noted leader and practitioner in this field, and Dan Benedict and Taylor Burton-Edwards are well known to you. Sister Anne Ferguson exercises deep care in overseeing our many worship services. So snoop around in your Annual Conference and ask about Continuing Education monies that might be available. Many Conferences and other institutions have such funds and I dare say (!) that using them on our event is particularly good stewardship of them. You may quote me. Tell your congregation how important it is for you to attend, and think about asking them for increased support. We should speak more highly of continuing education and spiritual formation events; normally congregations benefit from your attendance.

I have another cluster of thoughts on retreat costs. The Order keeps a small scholarship fund for retreats, which is administered by our Chancellor General, Brother Brent. Perhaps you need to ask about it. Perhaps some of you should consider contributing to it. Here is perhaps the boldest step of all: There is nothing to stop any of you, individually or as a chapter, from actually paying someone's way to attend the retreat. Think about it, and especially as we seek to form the next generation of leaders in the Order.


The topic for our presentations will be "**Worship in the Emerging Church**" and will utilize the wisdom of four resource people: Rev. Daniel Benedict, O.S.L., Rev. Taylor Burton-Edwards, O.S.L., Rev. Dr. Mark Stamm, O.S.L., and the Rev. Karen Ward, Abbess of The Church of the Apostles.

Their presentations will consider the nature and impact of the Emerging Church on The United Methodist Church, within the large Christian community, and the theological import of this movement.

- **Karen Ward** will bring the perspective of a practitioner leading an emerging church congregation.
- **Br. Mark Stamm** will be offering reflections throughout the retreat, as well as giving a formal presentation. We want to know what needs the worship of emerging churches is addressing and how or if this can be echoed in established congregations.
- **Br. Taylor Burton-Edwards** will be considering this from a United Methodist perspective.
- **Br. Dan Benedict** will share his thoughts from a broader range of concern.

The Retreat will unfold around the times for daily prayer and the Eucharist, a pattern that speaks to the heart and soul of our identity as members of The Order. Our corporate worship is the occasion of healing, praising, renewing, uplifting us, and is as essential to our gatherings as the content on which we focus.

## **TRAVEL INFORMATION FOR THE 2007 OSL RETREAT IN REDLANDS**

Are you coming to Redlands for the Retreat in October? If you will need transportation from Ontario International Airport or the San Bernardino Metrolink/Amtrak Station, please submit the Travel Reservation Form that is included in this issue of the Font with your registration

Here are some helpful travel hints for getting to the Retreat, provided by Br. Bob Davis (cumc@tstonramp.com):

It is preferred that you fly into Ontario International Airport. (ONT) with it's two state-of-the-art terminals provides over 200 daily flights to every major city in the U.S. and has capacity to accommodate 10 million passengers a year. This is the quickest and easiest way to get to get picked up and taken to Redlands. Of course, rental cars are available if that is your desire.

If you fly into Los Angeles International Airport (LAX) you will want to use the non-stop FlyAway bus service between LAX and Los Angeles Union Station. The 20-mile ride takes less than 45 minutes even during peak traffic periods because the bus uses high-occupancy-vehicle lanes. FlyAway buses pick up at every LAX terminal on the Arrival/Lower level under the green signs indicating "FlyAway, Buses and Long-Distance Vans." These pickups between 5:00 a.m. and 1:00 a.m. are every 30 minutes on the hour and half-hour of every day. (Every hour on the hour between 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m.)

Passengers traveling from LAX to Union Station must pay bus fare upon arrival at the ticket kiosk adjacent to LAX FlyAway stop at Berth 9 on the Transit Plaza at Union Station. Payment for tickets is with cash only. No personal checks, credit or debit cards accepted for purchases. A one-way adult ticket is \$3.00. FlyAway air-conditioned buses carry 55 passengers, are designed with luggage bays, and feature cushioned seats. Luggage is loaded and unloaded by a baggage handler.

After paying for your FlyAway bus ticket you will need to purchase a one-way ticket to board a Metrolink train going to San Bernardino. Machines do take certain credit cards. The proposed fare after July 1 would make a one-way ticket for the 58 mile trip cost approximately \$10.00 during the week (\$5.00 for seniors). On the weekend the regular rate would be \$7.50.

Directions for making the return trip will be available at the Retreat.

If, by chance, you should fly into the Burbank-Bob Hope Airport (BUR), there are numerous Metrolink trains that will take you from the airport to L. A. Union Station. It is only a 25 minute ride on the train. There is a free shuttle from the terminal to trackside. From Union Station take the Metrolink to San Bernardino.

[Union Station was built in 1939 and was considered the last great train station built in the U.S. Just its architecture makes it a stunning piece of Los Angeles history.]

If you should fly into the Orange County-John Wayne Airport (SNA), you will need to make your own arrangements.

Dear Brothers and Sisters:


