What makes you a member of the Order is your initial profession of vows, followed by an annual reaffirmation of those vows attested to on your reaffirmation form. If you are living where you can be part of a chapter, I really encourage you to

do that. It is a great opportunity to develop spiritual friendships and to enjoy worshipping together. But remember, telling your local chapter that you want to reaffirm is nice, but only the reaffirmation form in Sr. Jeanette's hands will make it happen!

A further clarification about financial gifts may be helpful.

There are no required "dues" to be a member of the Order. Because of the cost of publication, we do require a contribution if a member wishes to receive our periodicals by mail. Gifts from those taking annual vows, those who have taken life vows, and those who simply want to support our work are always needed and appreciated. Please give as you are able.

Sr. Jane Anne Ferguson (1935-2008)

Sr. Jane Anne Ferguson was 73 years old when she passed away on October 21, 2008, at Carle Foundation Hospital, Urbana, Illinois. Her memorial services were held on October 27 2008, at the Grace United Methodist Church, Urbana, Illinois, with the Rev. J. Michael Smith and the Rev. John Hamilton officiating. A family burial was held later in Woodlawn Cemetery, Urbana.

Reverend Ferguson was born on April 12, 1935, in Buffalo, N.Y. She was the daughter of Harry and Elsie Hanson Page. She married James C. Ferguson Jr. on Aug. 9, 1958, in LaGrange. He preceded her in death in 1994.

At the time of her death, Sr. Jane was survived by one son, James W. (Susan) Ferguson of Urbana; two daughters, Amy (Jeff) Rients of Urbana and Anne (Rod) Ferguson of Winthrop Harbor; three grandchildren, Ian and Alex Ferguson and Elizabeth Rients of Urbana; and one brother, John (Gloria) Page of Woodridge.

She was preceded in death by her parents and her husband.

Sr. Ferguson earned her B.A. in Special Education from the University of Illinois in 1957 and her Master of Divinity degree from the Christian Theological Seminary in 1990. She was ordained a deacon in 1988 and an elder in 1992 in the United Methodist Church.

She taught special education at Lyons Township High School, Elliot, and Gibson City, Illinois. She was the first teacher at Busy Hands Nursery School in Gibson City. She also served as an alderman from 1977 to 1987 in Gibson City. Sr. Jane worked at the First United Methodist Church for 10 years, first as the Christian

Education director and then as associate pastor. She pastored churches in Springfield at Jerome

UMC and Laurel UMC, and Mount Vernon Church in Champaign, Illinois. She was a member of the Champaign Kiwanis and the Grace UMC, Urbana. Sr. Jane was a member of the Order of St. Luke and an advocate for social justice.

Memorials in her name were made to the Cunningham Children's Home, Urbana, Illinois and to organizations of the donor's choice.

Requiescat in pace, Sr. Jane Anne Ferguson, as we remember you this day.

The Order's 75th Anniversary

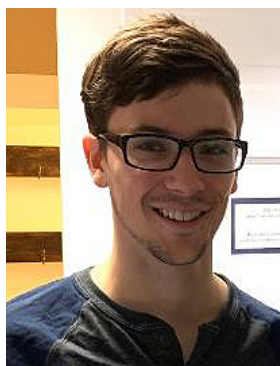

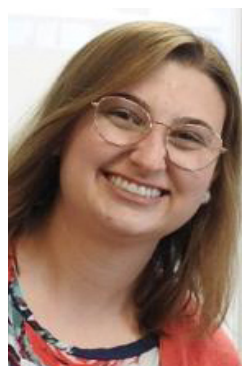

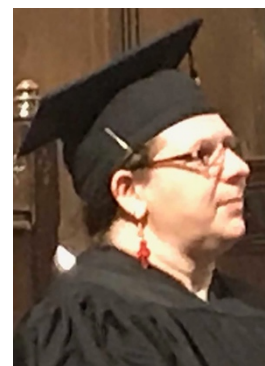

The Experiment

Many of us have referred to the Order of Saint Luke as a “well-kept secret,” but the Order should not be a secret! Those of us who are members find meaning and support and fellowship in (dispersed) community with our siblings in the Order.

In an effort to stop keeping this secret, a couple of us in the Order from New England decided to conduct an experiment: we reserved a table at the New England Annual Conference. We included tri-fold brochures about the Order, a sign-up sheet for those who wanted more information about the Order, the brief, portable Daily Office which the Order developed for those seeking a new method for daily prayer, and a book order sheet with my own copies of many OSL Publications books as sample copies. The photo shows what our table looked like.

Was it worth it? What were the results?

I returned to the table, the books had been looked through... and disarranged.

Many people took book order forms, and one person left her order with me. I had several conversations with folks about what the Order is, and I even met a former member who fell out of the Order when she moved to a location without a chapter. A couple of folks signed up to learn more, and we’re considering what sort of event might be best to introduce them to the Order. We don’t know what the lasting results of this effort may be, but we must trust God with the results. Our task is to be open about our own call to live sacramentally.

And if any of you have stories of other “experiments” in sharing information about the Order, please let me know! By pooling our ideas and bravely seeking opportunities to let others know about the Order, we are ensuring that our charism and our community will continue.

Council Meeting Summary

The Order of Saint Luke, May 20-24, 2019 Council Meeting, St. Paul of the Cross, Pittsburgh, PA

Those in attendance: Br. Dwight Vogel, Br. Daniel Benedict, Br. Jimmy DuFriend Sr. Alice Kay Lovelace, Br. Mark Stamm, Sr. Carol Gathagan, Br. David Eichelberger, Br. Dan Doty, Sr. Barbara Lee, Br. Matthias Tanner, Br. O. French Ball, Sr. Heather Josselyn-Cranson, Abbot Elizabeth Moore, Br. George Crisp, Sr. Jeanette Block. Br. Johnathan Hehn joined us by Zoom on Monday for our council meeting. Sr. Sarah Mount-Elewononi arrived on Wednesday at 9:00 a.m.

Abbot Elizabeth Moore called our meeting to order. Sr. Alice Kay telephoned Br. Rusty Beals as he did not attend the meeting as expected. Br. Rusty was admitted to Resurrection Hospital, Chicago, after collapsing while leaving his flight. (He has recovered.)

Abbot Elizabeth led a time of checking in with one another. She thereafter appointed Br. Jim DuFriend as the new companion for inquirers and novitiates, known as CIPM (Companions, Inquirers, Probationary Members). We thanked Sr. Carol Cathagan for her faithfulness to this task. Abbot Elizabeth also shared the problem with oslpublishings.org being hijacked and corrupted. We have lost this domain name and decided to hire a webmaster to redesign www.saint-luke.net to avoid future issues and to have a more

professional website. (Since the Council meeting, Sr. Jeanette Block has hired Mr. Joe Kelly of Com-1 to design and maintain our website. Mr. Kelly charged a flat fee of \$1,650.00, which was paid on June 26, 2019, and The Order will be charged \$10.00 per month beginning 2020 for maintenance.) With the new website, we are seeking to have all publications/periodicals, affirmations, registrations, etc., on a digital platform so they are available to all. This will eliminate the need for mailing, as postage is expensive.

Br. George Crisp shared that the Hoyt Hickman award was given to 16 seminarians this year. Two schools opted out, Garrett Evangelical, and Christian Theological. However, Gammon Theological in Atlanta has been added to the award recipients for 2020. Sr. Bron Yocum is the formation director at Palmer Seminary and she would like to be added to the list for 2020. Br. George will extend the invitation to award winners to attend retreat as a guest of The Order.

This fall, October 14 - 17, 2019 is the retreat in Pittsburgh. The Daily Office Revision Team will meet October 13-14. Two iconographers, Randi Sider-Rose, and Michael Kapeluck, are the artists. "Glimpses of Heaven: Iconography and Spirituality" is the program. Thursday afternoon, there will be a hands-on workshop by Ms. Sider-Rose. The additional fee will be in the registration.

Our 75th Anniversary is 2021, in Pittsburgh. The hope is Br. Mark Stamm will share the progress of Our Story Project. Br. Dwight Vogel moved to authorize Sr. Jeanette Block to trademark all of our logos. Seconded by Br. Jim DuFriend. Affirmed by consensus. (Since our council meeting, Sr. Jeanette has engaged an attorney, Norman Lehrner, Esq., who has filed our logo and our name with the patent and trademark offices as of June 14, 2019. Mr. Lehrner, as a professional courtesy, fixed his fee at \$1,000.)

Br. Dwight moved to allow the General Officers to make a decision on behalf of The Order to institute suit against GoDaddy. Seconded by Br. French Ball. Affirmed by consensus. (Since the council meeting, Sr. Jeanette's husband, Ronald M. Block Esq., is filing suit against GoDaddy for the unauthorized release of our domain name, oslpublishings.org. This work is being done pro bono by Mr. Block.)

Sr. Jeanette presented the proposed budget for 2019-20 of \$46,950. The budget was affirmed and accepted for presentation to the General Chapter in October.

Sr. Heather Josselyn-Cranson encouraged us to pray for all of our chapters and associations. Her action items included dissolving the Pfeiffer Chapter in North Carolina and the request for Provincial Companions for Pennsylvania and Nebraska. We

accepted the dissolution with regret. Abbot Elizabeth indicated that she will fill in for Br. Jay Brown while he is attending to his wife's health issues. She shared how book orders are fulfilled. Most sales are through Kindle Direct Publishing (formerly Create Space).

Br. Daniel Benedict reported that he received boxes of publications files from Sr. Bron Yocum, which he went through and made notations on some files. Br. Daniel gave copies of items to be saved to Sr. Jeanette (royalty agreements and ISBN's). He has retained what is relevant and asked Br. David Eichelberger to take items to the archives. (Archives are held at Drew University.)

Br. Daniel appeared at North American Academy of Literature and took care of the book table (along with Abbot Elizabeth and Sr. Heather). He is working with Sr. Carolyn Tanner on a book to teach the basic pattern of worship at Vacation Bible School and with congregations.

Sr. Sarah Mount-Elewononi is working on Doxology and issues will be available on the new website. Sr. Abbot encouraged Sr. Sarah to engage with young scholars so their work has a platform for publication. Sr. Cynthia Astle is still getting The Font out quarterly.

Br. Jonathan Hehn was in attendance via Zoom and discussed Sacramental Life. The Order of Corpus Christi, affiliated with the

United Church of Christ would like to contribute to SacLife.

Br. Jonathan Hehn shared via Aoom became aware of the community of The Order of Corpus Christi, which is affiliated with the UCC, and has been in touch with them for an article for Sacramental Life. Br. Jonathan would like to move the periodical forward to do a joint venture with this community. Br. David Eichelberger moved that we entertain a joint venture between Sacramental Life and Order of Corpus Christi (OCC) on a trial basis for two years, to be reviewed in 2021. Seconded by Br. Dan Doty. Affirmed by consensus.

We affirmed Br. Jonathan's excellent work with SacLife and he is looking to expand the editorial team. We agreed, on a motion by Sr. Heather Josslyn-Cranson, for Br. Jonathan to explore this expansion.

Br. Dwight Vogel shared that the Daily Office Revision Team worked hard on Monday. The Web Access Daily Office, or WADO, needs attention for input of the information. Abbot Elizabeth explained the volume of work that needs to be put into WADO. There are lots of prayers and hymns done by season, but there are gaps on every season. Abbot Elizabeth is hoping Br. David Lovelace will be able to help with this. Folks are using the site and finding errors, which have been corrected. Helpers are welcome. Abbot

Elizabeth will create an instruction sheet for how to enter items.

Br. Dwight would like to field test the Lukan Psalter, so if we want copies, Br. Dwight will send it along. The Lukan Psalter is coming to a close.

Br. David Eichelberger continues to respond to prayer requests. He has encouraged members of The Order if moving, retiring, to not throw anything away, but to get it to him for the archives. We discussed the changes in technology and the effects to the archives. Br. David encourage us to print what we have.

Br. Daniel Benedict shared his Novitiate report; we were prompted to develop a process of living out the Rule of Life and Service by Sr. Joyce Ann Zimmerman, who facilitated a prior retreat. The Novitiate has three steps: step one seeking, step two discernment and step three probation. We discussed at length the process that we have created. Sr. Barbara shared that there are about 30 people who are processing involvement in The Order.

Br. Mark Stamm's report on Our Story Project was shared. It is going well; the interviews are interesting, and he encouraged all of us to journal our experiences in The Order as this is not meant to be formal interviews, but reflections. This is meant to be a social history.

French Ball moved that Abbot Elizabeth appoint a committee of three to return to our fall council meeting with a specific recommendation to amend Article VIII, of the Constitution, Disbursement of Assets. If approved, the community to vote by email or first-class mail to amend the Constitution. Seconded by Br. Dwight Vogel. Affirmed by consensus. Abbot Elizabeth appointed Br. Dan Doty, Sr. Heather Josselyn-Cranson and Br. Dwight Vogel.

There being no further business, our Council meeting was adjourned at 3:45 Wednesday, May 22, 2019. We concluded with mid-day prayer led by Sr. Barbara Lee.

Liturgical Notes

All Sundays, Solemnities and Feasts are in bold type and followed by the proper liturgical color for the day or part of the day.
