ABBOT'S LETTER

I'm writing to you all from the airport, on my way home from retreat. The glow of warm companionship and rich worship is mingling with thoughts of work to do once I get home... But I wanted to share a particular phrase that struck me during our service of Profession of Vows this morning.

Each of the five siblings who took life vows today declared their promise to live out the Rule of Life and Service for their entire lives. At the end of that promise, each person read the words "May the grace of the Holy Spirit, the example of the apostles, and the bonds of this community always be my help."

"The bonds of this community...." Community does bring boundaries and bonds with it. When we join a community, we are surrendering (at least in part) our individualistic freedom. We agree to live together with one another and to curtail our actions and words in respect to the needs of others. Whereas our culture preaches the desirability of boundless freedom, those of us in the Order have chosen to submit to the bonds of community.

But we recognize that community bonds also provide strength and assistance. Assembled together, we can support one another. We rely on the wisdom that each member brings, and we find orientation through the guidance of the community. In addition to the help that we find in God and in our tradition (in the scriptures and the examples of those who have gone before), we find true comfort and succor in "the bonds of this community" – in our relationships with one another.

If you are a member of the Order and these bonds seem imperceptible to you, please reach out to me. There are myriads of ways that OSL members can connect with one another: physical meetings of geographically-oriented chapters but also prayer over Zoom, phone calls with companions or Accountability partners, participation in on-line worship opportunities each month, service as a companion to an Inquirer... It takes encouragement and support to live out our Rule of Life and Service. We all deserve to feel connected to other members of the Order, and together we can find ways to participate in the mutual sustenance that the Order can provide.

New OSL WhatsApp Community

The Order of St. Luke now has an official Community on WhatsApp. WhatsApp is a free messaging app that allows users to send text messages, make voice and video calls, and share photos, videos, and documents. It's available on smartphones and can also be accessed on a computer. WhatsApp uses your phone's internet connection to send messages so there are no fees, even if you are texting or calling internationally.

In our OSL WhatsApp community, you'll find a General chat room, an Announcements room, and a room for each Chapter or Association. Feel free to join whichever ones interest you. Chapters can use their chat to remind folks of upcoming chapter meetings, share prayer needs, start discussions, or share liturgies. Monday Compline recently reminded folks in their chat that they would begin Compline in 10 minutes, and they doubled their usual attendance!

We'll use the General room for Order-wide discussions and the Announcement room for information on upcoming all-Order online liturgies or other events.
